Wings for Autism® also gives airport, airline, TSA professionals and other personnel the

opportunity to observe, interact and deliver their services in a structured learning environment.

"Traveling can be stressful for anyone, but for children and adults with developmental disabilities, the process can be even more intimidating," said Abe Weber, airport director. "I want traveling through Appleton International Airport to be a fun and exciting experience for everyone. I'm proud to support The Arc along with Allegiant Air and our local partnering agencies as they raise awareness through their Wings for Autism event."

"We are excited to bring the Wings For Autism program back to Appleton Airport," said Peter Burns, CEO of The Arc of the United States. "This program will not only alleviate the stress children and their parents feel, but help educate airport and airlines professionals about how best to serve children with autism or other intellectual and developmental disabilities in the future."
